

The Ikebukuro Library, Niiza Library, and Niiza Repository Library have a collection of over 1.92 million Japanese and overseas publications, including books, magazines, and newspapers. All three libraries provide ample seating and offer comfortable learning environments equipped with reading spaces, PC stations, and AV booths tailored to differing browsing styles and access hours.







Rikkyo University was selected by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science, and Technology (MEXT) for the Top Global University Project (Global Traction Type). This project, initiated in 2014, is intended to strengthen the international competitiveness of universities in Japan. To this end, the project provides priority support to universities dedicated to thorough internationalization and university reforms.


A Historical Campus with Modern Facilities

Ikebukuro Campus features buildings like the ivy-coated Morris Hall, a serene chapel, and Mather Library Memorial Hall, designated as Selected Historical Buildings by the Tokyo Metropolitan Government. The campus offers numerous charming spots, including Suzukake-no-michi (Sycamore Avenue), which serves as a peaceful retreat for students throughout the seasons, and the Himalayan cedars at the main gate, which are adorned with Christmas lights in December. The campus is also home to Ikebukuro Library, one of Japan's leading libraries, with two million publications and a seating capacity of 1,520, as well as the Paul Rusch Athletics Center, complete with a 50-meter pool, tennis courts, and a fitness room.




Niiza campus is located in Niiza City, Saitama Prefecture, just outside the Tokyo metropolitan area and about 20 minutes from Ikebukuro. It offers abundant greenery and an open atmosphere, with classrooms and laboratories that offer state-of-the-art equipment, a spacious sporting facility, and Niiza Library, which is also open to Niiza residents. The second floor of Niiza Library houses SHIORI (The Niiza Library Learning Commons), which is comprised of three types of spaces to accommodate different styles of group learning.

Entrance examination system for April enrollment*

Rikkyo University runs a dual-track system of admissions for international students seeking a degree from the university: admission by written exam and interview or admission by document screening.

Since classes are conducted in Japanese, applicants are expected to have sufficient mastery of the language. (This does not apply to the Global Course of the Department of International Business Law.)

*For more information about the entrance examination system for admission in April or September, please visit the website shown below. Rikkyo University's PEACE Program (with admission in April or September) was launched in September 2022. With its own separate entrance examination, the PEACE Program offers three majors/programs provided by the College of Intercultural Communication, the College of Law and Politics, and the Global Liberal Arts Program, as an English-language program in which all classes are taught in English. Up to 28 students will be accepted into the program each year. Japanese language ability is not considered during the admission process, but applicants are expected to have high-level English language skills (with a TOEFL iBT score of at least 94, or an IELTS score of at least 6.5). https://en.admission.rikkyo.ac.jp/



Scholarship Systems

Scholarship Systems

Rikkyo University offers several different scholarship systems to provide financial and academic support to international students. Scholarships for privately-financed international students include Rikkyo University scholarships and external scholarships offered by the Japan Student Services Organization (JASSO) and other private scholarship foundations.

Applicants who wish to apply for scholarships that require a recommendation from the university must register a scholarship application registration during the specified period each academic year after enrolling.

Rikkyo University has established a new scholarship, the Rikkyo Promising Future Scholarship, which can be applied for in advance prior to enrollment. This is available starting with undergraduate enrollment for the 2022 academic year. We are implementing a scholarship system for privately-financed international students who have a strong desire to study at Rikkyo University, with the goal of welcoming outstanding international students from countries and regions all over the world to our university, and cultivating talent that will be active on the future international stage.

The scholarship is awarded to one applicant from each College, selected from applicants who have passed the entrance exam for international students (admission by document screening; does not apply to the College of Intercultural Communication) or the entrance exam for international students (admission by written exam and interview). The scholarship will be granted every semester after enrollment. (The recipient will be required to have completed payment of all enrollment fees at the time of enrollment.)



Career Center

International students seeking to find work in Japan after graduation are generally subject to the same screening processes as their Japanese peers. This makes it vital to get a head start and to gather information and prepare as early as possible.

Rikkyo University offers international students a wide range of support to launch their careers in Japan.

Career and job-hunting support for international students



Learning and honing your talents in Japan

Rikkyo University helps international students find jobs and develop their careers through two avenues of support. The Career Center and the International Office offer support tailored to each academic year and development stage, including diverse assistance programs and the distribution of guides, while each college offers support that leverages its unique expertise.

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Strengthening your Japanese skills

Rikkyo University offers Japanese language courses to help international students acquire the Japanese communication skills needed to find work in Japan and excel in business settings. Through these subjects, students can learn the conversational expressions and writing techniques required to successfully navigate Japan's unique job market.

In addition, the Center for Japanese Language Education and Japanese Language Support Desk offer writing tips on how to prepare job application and other forms when seeking employment.





Global Lounge

Both campuses feature global lounges that act as centers for the exchange of information on study abroad and international exchange. Students interested in international exchange or study abroad can learn side-by-side with international students from all over the world.

Regular internal exchange events are held, including World Café and intercultural events.



Prayer Room

As part of efforts to provide an environment for accommodating the growing number of international students from around the world, a prayer room was established at Ikebukuro Campus in April 2016. It is mainly expected to be used by Muslim students but can also be used for any religious practice.





Housing

Many international students live in private dormitories or

When you sign a lease on an apartment, you must pay a security deposit and key money, in addition to rent.

Institutional Guarantee System

Under this system, Rikkyo University will act as the joint liability quarantor for international students who are unable to find such guarantors for residential leases for the period for which they are enrolled at the university, provided certain conditions are met. In addition to having the university confirm the content of the lease, the student will be required to enroll in the Comprehensive Renters' Insurance for International Students Studying in Japan among other

• Real estate agency partnering with Rikkyo University

Rikkyo University has partnered with a real estate agency called House Mate Shop to provide students with apartment referrals. Those using this agency's services will receive a housing referral for an agent fee equal to about half a month's rent.

International student dormitories

Rikkyo University operates the following international dormitories: Rikkyo University International Dormitory (RUID) Asakadai and Shiki, Rikkyo International Residence (RIR) Shiinamachi, and Rikkyo Global House. While priority is granted to exchange students from partner universities, rooms designated for exchange students that become free will be made available to privately-financed international students for a limited period of four months.



Living expenses

The average cost of living for Tokyo (Ikebukuro) is estimated to be about ¥140,000 per month.

Many other expenses can arise related to the cost of getting yourself settled when you arrive in Japan.

Earthquakes

The buildings at Rikkyo University were built to withstand earthquakes of up to 7 on the Japanese seismic intensity scale. In preparation for a major earthquake, the university has set up a safety confirmation system that will serve as a communication hub in times of emergency. If an earthquake with an intensity of upper 5 or higher strikes Tokyo or Saitama Prefecture, the safety confirmation system will be activated, and safety confirmation e-mails will be sent automatically to students' preregistered mobile phones.



Health

Our Health Centers can provide annual health checks, various types of health checkups, health education and consultations, and emergency treatment. At the Clinic on Ikebukuro Campus, students can be treated for illnesses and other medical issues just as in ordinary medical clinics.

International students must join Japan's National Health Insurance system, regardless of their duration of stay. By joining the National Health Insurance system and paying a monthly premium, students will only need to pay 30% of the total fee for treatment and medication. All Rikkyo University students have the option of joining the Rikkyo University Student Mutual Aid Health Insurance Union at the time of their enrollment to receive medical expense coverage and vaccination subsidies



Student Counseling Center

Students can stop by the Student Counseling Center to discuss problems and concerns related to student life. They can consult with highly knowledgeable staff, professional counselors, psychiatrists, and other professionals about any university life issues, including personal relationships, personality issues, and mental health. English-language counseling is available at the Student Counseling Center in Ikebukuro Campus.

In addition, the Center offers a variety of programs designed to aid students in building a successful university life, include assertiveness training to help students better express themselves and group work and physical training designed to assist them in interpersonal relationships and self-discovery.



Center for Japanese Language Education

The Center for Japanese Language Education provides detailed Japanese language education for international students, including opportunities to learn about various aspects of Japanese culture and language. It also offers a Japanese Language Support Desk to provide support for students who are not native Japanese speakers.



International students need a student visa to study at Rikkyo University.

If an applicant does not already have a valid visa status for Japan, Rikkyo University will apply for a Certificate of Eligibility on their behalf.

Depending on the duration of their visa, applicants will need to apply directly to an Immigration Services Agency to extend or change* their visa status.

*Individuals who have an Engineer / Specialist in Humanities / International Services, Dependent, or other visa status and wish to change it to College Student must apply for a change of visa status when enrolling at Rikkyo University.

There is no obligation to do this, but those who lack College Student visa status will not be able to receive support services for international students.

Residency Management System

International students studying at Rikkyo University are eligible for the Residency Management System. The durations of a student visa status are 4 years and 3 months; 4 years; 3 years and 3 months; 2 years and 3 months; 2 years and 3 months; 1 year; 6 months: and 3 months.

Requesting Permission to Engage in Activity Other than That Permitted under the Status of Residence Previously Granted (part-time work)

The student visa is intended for those who will study or pursue research in Japan. International students who wish to work part-time (i.e. engage in an activity in which the individual will be financially compensated for his or her labor) must obtain permission to engage in activities other than that permitted under the status of residence previously granted by the Immigration Services Agency. Students will be permitted to work up to 28 hours per week. During periods designated by Rikkyo University as academic breaks, students will be permitted to work up to 8 hours per day.


