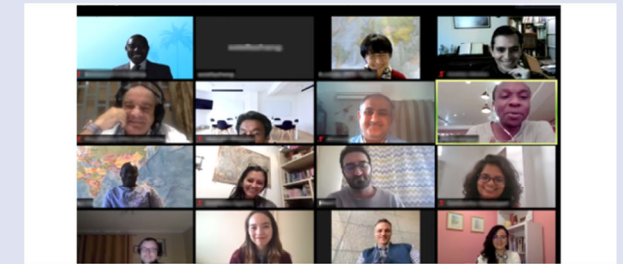

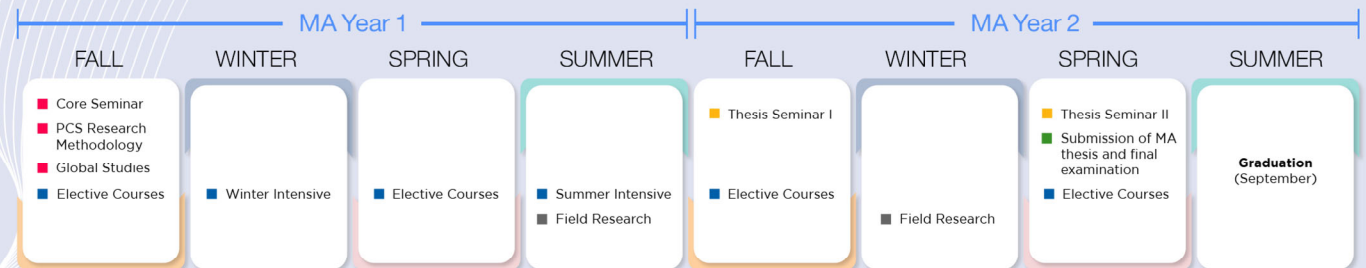
Overview

Peace and Conflict Studies (PCS) is a course of study offered as part of the Tokyo University of Foreign Studies (TUFS) Graduate School of Global Studies Master's Program. Since its inception in 2004, the PCS course of study focuses on the concept of "building peace and preventing conflict" from a perspective that supplements the Western context, while nurturing professionals with expertise on topics related to peace and conflict, development, governance, and other areas of international and global affairs.

Curriculum

PCS admits approximately twelve students per year, providing a very intimate and intensive educational dynamic between students and faculty. Many of our students come from conflict-affected countries and the program provides opportunities for everyone to gain valuable experience in cross-cultural contact and understanding, and in working collaboratively.

The course of study is designed for students from diverse cultural and academic/professional backgrounds. Combining substantial coursework and a master's thesis often based on original field research, PCS strives to expand the expertise of existing Peace and Conflict professionals, as well as provide a thorough foundation of understanding to those who wish to enter into the field.
